<sup>1</sup> Known as the ‘Asian Group’ until August 2011, when the official name became ‘Group of Asia and the Pacific Small Island Developing States’ and, in short form, the ‘Asia-Pacific Group’. The Group is considered to have 54 members when the total includes Palestine, which has been affiliated as a full member of this group since 1986. However, because Palestine has not been admitted to the UN as a Member State, for electoral purposes the Group is considered to have 53 members.

<sup>2</sup> ‘WEOG’ has 28 full members, plus the United States as an observer. The United States attends meetings of WEOG and is considered a member of that group for electoral purposes.

<sup>3</sup> Turkey is a member of ‘WEOG’ for electoral purposes. It caucuses with both ‘WEOG’ and the ‘Asia-Pacific Group’.
